There Is No Redemption Or Second Chance for Rebellious Angels



Angelic choices are made by a fully informed, supernatural intellect

Hence, a decision once made is irrevocable, eternally unchanging and wholly reflective of their fidelity (or lack of it) to God's rule

The dimension of *time* also likely applies differently to angels, who probably spend most of their existence in *eternity*

Can an eternal mind change?

Speculation About Satan



Refusing to serve God, ejected from Heaven and looking forward only to an eternity in Hell, his future was indeed, very bleak

Cursing the Almighty, Satan vowed to take every single one of God's newly created human beings to Hell with him, if he could

With his angelic powers, as well as his access to the Earth intact, the rest is history

From the Catechism:

of our first parents lurks a seductive voice, opposed to God, which makes them fall into death out of envy.

Scripture and the Church's Tradition see in this being a fallen angel, called "Satan" or the "devil". The Church teaches that Satan was at first a good angel, made by God:

"The devil and the other demons were indeed created naturally good by God, but they became evil by their own doing."

Willingly Swindled

Adam traded away everything that he owned, including all the physical, temporal gifts God had given him:

Genesis 1:26 "... dominion over the fishes of the sea, and the fowls of the air, and the beasts, and the whole earth, and every creeping creature that moved upon the earth".

> This was Satan's price for imparting "The Knowledge of Good and Evil"


The process was technically "legal" but it certainly wasn't right

Only One With *the Power of Everlasting Life* Could Overcome *Death*



In fact, thousands of years would elapse before the exact time, place and circumstances for Messiah would arrive








A "Last-Chance" for Lost Souls

Jesus knows that life is an ordeal, in part, because He personally lived it, so He has granted the faithful a rich reward, according to his grace:







Actual Grace: Enlightens, guides and empowers us to conform our human will to God's divine will

Sanctifying Grace: The living presence of the Holy Spirit dwelling within a human soul; the "Currency of Heaven"; transforms us, making us holy and acceptable to God

Satan's myriad, brutal counter attacks would need to be blunted and turned aside, until the end of time






Magisterium: A Holy Office and Sacred Trust

The Magisterium is the authoritative teaching office of the Church, personally commissioned by Jesus Christ and held in common by every Catholic Bishop, including and most importantly, the Pope


The Bishops also typically delegate this teaching authority to their faithful and trusted assistants: the priests, deacons, and certain lay persons



Why we venerate the Blessed Virgin Mary

Definition of "venerate": To honor and/or hold in very high esteem.

To treat with respect, reverence and affection, according to relationship, position, privilege, high office and/or personal merit.



That Has Never Changed! Inspired by the Holy Spirit, confirmed by the Sacred Deposit of the Faith and illuminated by grace, faith and reason, Christians have always and everywhere greatly loved, esteemed and revered the Blessed Virgin Mary, asking her to "put in a good word for us" with our (and her) risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ



What do we know about the meaning of the terms "Full of Grace" and "Blessed Art Thou Among Women" in the context of the Blessed Virgin Mary's uniquely privileged existence and divine motherhood?

A prophetic passage from the Old Testament's "The Wisdom of Solomon" (7:25-26) gives us a very good "sense" of it



"Solomon" employs female, gender specific language that not only describes various Marian attributes and privileges, but also harkens back to the time when God, in the beginning, created Adam and Eve in a state of grace, according to his own image and likeness (Genesis 1:26-31)

In order to fulfill her divinely predestined mission as the Mother of God, Mary was also conceived "Full of Grace" ... totally free of sin ... and Mary, the "New Eve" would never "fall" from God's grace

"The Immaculate Conception"

Mary was preserved from all sin from the moment she was conceived in her mother's womb

"Full of Grace"
Mary's human nature
remained perfectly
intact; her body
and spirit,
absolutely pure

Mary acted with humility and of her own free will God's superabundant graces empowered the Mother of God to cooperate with his will and his plan without fail Mary never sinned

A Holy and Suitable Mother for Jesus Christ the King of Kings and Lord of Lords

The Blessed Virgin Mary was divinely graced and specially privileged for the Glory of God and for the Purpose of Our Salvation

Mary cooperated with God's redemptive plan in many, many ways; one way in particular, is absolutely unique:


She permitted our Holy Redeemer's human body to be made from her own pure and sinless flesh

Luke 1:35

... the Holy **Ghost shall** come upon thee and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee.



And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

Mary – The "Woman" of Prophecy



Genesis 3:15

I will put enmities between thee and the woman and thy seed and her seed: she (he) shall crush thy head, and thou shall lie in wait for her (his) heel.

(The original scriptural text curiously accommodates both genders)

Mary - The "Virgin" of Isaiah



Isaiah 7:14 Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign. Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son and his name shall be called Emmanuel (God with us)



Tradition holds that Mary like many Jewish girls of her time was consecrated to God at the age of three by means of a formal **Temple ceremony**

Since there was no way for them to know if/how and/or at what point in their life God might choose to "call" upon them, young maidens dedicated to God in this manner vowed to remain perpetually (forever) virgin

The Holy Church knows this from history, from the Bible and Tradition, and from the Blessed Virgin Mary's personal testimony

According to the Law of Moses such vows of "perpetual" virginity would apply even to married couples

From the Book of Numbers - Chapter 30


3-4: ... when a woman vows a vow to the LORD, and binds herself by a pledge, while within her father's house, in her youth, and her father hears of her vow and of her pledge by which she has bound herself, and says nothing to her; then all her vows shall stand ...

6-7: And if she is married to a husband, while under her vows ... and her husband hears of it, and says nothing to her on the day that he hears; then her vows shall stand, and her pledges by which she has bound herself shall stand.

Short of the father or husband acting in a timely manner to "legally" renounce the vow, it would remain in effect for life, with no further recourse available

According to the Law of Moses, intentionally disregarding such a vow would constitute a very serious ... and even "deadly" sin

Mary - "Queen Mother" In the Tradition of the Royal House of David...





The Apostles, particularly St. John, understood the "whole" truth about the Blessed Virgin Mary

St. Anselm of Canterbury (1033-1109)

One of the great philosophers and theologians of the middle ages; **Declared A Doctor of the Church by Pope Clement XI in 1720**



Saint Anselm is likely the most important Christian theologian between Saint Augustine and Saint Thomas Aquinas His favored area of theology: "Why God Should Become Man" (In Order To Redeem Us)

On God's Justice and the Law

Man naturally owes honor, obedience and allegiance to God in all things, so with what could man pay for his sin against God?

Man alone, possesses nothing that can satisfy his debt to God for sin.

On Sin and Death

For as death came upon the human race by the disobedience of man, it was fitting that by man's obedience life should be restored.

On Vanquishing Satan

And so also was it proper that the devil, man's tempter, who had conquered him in eating of the tree, should be vanquished by man in the suffering of the tree which man bore.

Why Was Suffering Necessary?

If man was overcome by the devil in the easiest manner possible, so as to dishonor God by sinning against him, is it not right that man, in making satisfaction for his sin, should honor God by conquering the devil with the greatest possible difficulty?

Why Only God Should Redeem Us

... if any other being should rescue man from eternal death, man would rightly be adjudged as the servant of that being.

Now if this be so, he would in no wise be restored to that dignity which would have been his had he never sinned.

Why Only God Could Redeem Us

Jesus Christ, the only divinely acceptable sacrifice for the sins of the world suffered, died and rose again in order to restore all that had been lost.

Such was the will of his Father in Heaven and absolutely nothing less would justly suffice.

From the Catechism: Jesus was handed over according to God's mysterious plan



of chance in an unfortunate coincidence of circumstances, but is part of the *mystery* of God's plan, as St. Peter explains to the Jews of Jerusalem in his first sermon on Pentecost:

"This Jesus [was] delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God."

393 This Biblical language does not mean that those who handed him over were merely passive players in a scenario written in advance by God.


For the sake of accomplishing his plan of salvation, God permitted the acts that flowed from their blindness.

600 To God, all moments of time are present in their immediacy. When therefore he establishes his eternal plan of "predestination", he includes in it each person's free response to his grace:



Attempting To Resolve God's Greatest Mystery






"The passion of Christ was of such value that it sufficed to expiate (atone for) all the sins of the whole world; even of a hundred thousand worlds."



Christ's One Time, Once for All Holy Sacrifice On the Cross At Calvary Was Prefigured In the Sacrifices of Old

Because the life of the flesh is in the blood: and I have given it to you, that you may make atonement with it upon the altar for your souls, and the blood may be for an expiation of the soul.



The Perfect, Atoning Sacrifice

(Romans 3:25, Hebrews 2:17)

Jesus is our "propitiation" because he freely, heroically and charitably became the sacrificial victim, atoning for our sins by his suffering and death. His perfect, infinitely valuable, divine sacrifice, as one of us and on our behalf, destroyed Satan's power, appeased God's wrath and restored God's eternal favor, obtaining good will, grace, forgiveness and peace for those who love him

Christ's total self-giving for our salvation



From the Catechism:

766 The Church is born primarily of Christ's total self-giving for our salvation, anticipated in the institution of the Eucharist and fulfilled on the cross.

"The origin and growth of the Church are symbolized by the blood and water which flowed from the open side of the crucified Jesus ..."

The Church was born from the pierced heart of Jesus Christ



"For it was from the side of Christ as he slept the sleep of death upon the cross that there came forth the 'wondrous sacrament' of the whole Church."

As Eve was formed from the sleeping Adam's side, so the Church was born from the pierced heart of Christ hanging dead on the cross.

According to the Law of Sin and Death Satan held the power of death over every sinner but Jesus was totally without sin and therefore not subject to Satan and certainly not obliged to die

Hence, not even the devil had the power or authority to do even the slightest harm to the holy Christ and no one could forcibly take his life from him

John 14:29-30

And now I have told you before it comes to pass: that when it shall come to pass, you may believe...

for the prince of this world is coming and he has no power over me...



Since the time and manner of His sacrificial death had been divinely preordained, Jesus obediently gave himself up to be crucified, only to rise again from the dead three days hence



Willingly assisted by Pilate, Herod, the Chief Priests, Pharisees, Judas and others, the devil's fate was sealed the moment Jesus gave up his spirit



And we are witnesses of all things that He did in the land of the Jews and in Jerusalem: whom they killed, hanging Him upon a tree.

Him God raised up the third day ...

Jesus' Resurrected Body Is Real Not An Illusion Or Apparition

A real, human body, supernaturally transformed into glory, fully compatible with the divine realities of everlasting life, on earth and in heaven

Our resurrected bodies will be just like his!

John 6:40

And this is the will of my Father who sent me: that every one who sees the Son and believes in him may have life everlasting.

And I will raise him up on the last day.

The Mystery: Revealed and Explained

The devil had been put on notice in the beginning that God would send a holy and powerful redeemer

But the precise time and method of our redemption, as well as the identity of the Messiah, was known only to God

In the thousands
of years that elapsed
between Eden and Calvary,
Satan had put to death with impunity,
uncounted millions of poor souls

The "Prince of This World" may have been within his "rights" to treat sinners that way (See the Book of Job)

but the Holy Messiah would prove to be essentially and very substantially different

1st Chronicles 16:22

Touch not my anointed: and do no evil to my prophets.

No one, not even the devil, the undisputed "Prince of This World" had the power or authority to do even the slightest harm to the impeccably holy and sinless Jesus Christ: the long awaited "Messiah" and "Son of Man"; the ultimate priest, prophet and king

(The term "Christ" means "Anointed One")

It was left solely
up to the devil to correctly discern
at his own peril, the critical difference
between ordinary sinners and the Holy Messiah

Satan was an expert at quoting the sacred texts.

He knew all the prophecies, was aware of all the "signs" and should have been able to recognize the Messiah, whenever and wherever he arrived

The devil should have known, but blinded by hate and pride, as well as a long "unholy tradition" of sin and death, he just couldn't stop himself from crucifying Jesus, the Lord of glory!

Of course Jesus permitted the crucifixion for that is why he came into the world, knowing full well that the devil would be severely judged for this most grievous of all possible offenses and mankind redeemed

Everything Satan had earlier gained by Adam's "fall" was now forfeit; his evil dominion of death, destroyed!

The risen Christ, who had personally overcome the world, the flesh and the devil for us, would rule forever more as the holy, triumphant and merciful head of all mankind: "The Lord of Life"

Once
the Power of Death
had been overcome
by the resurrected Jesus,
all of the faithful:

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to the greater glory, praise and honor of God the Father

obtained the power to overcome death, as well

Anyone who is capable of overcoming death in and through Jesus Christ has nothing to fear from Satan, demonic hordes, or any mortal man!

The Apostles and the other Holy Martyrs of the universal Church most certainly knew and believed this – as should we

God the Father would "ratify" the Kingship of Jesus Christ with resurrection, new life, grace, kinship, forgiveness and peace

The Holy Spirit

would provide consolation, power, advocacy, infallible truth and a supernatural abundance of other miraculous gifts to the faithful members of his universal Church

Satan and his minions would become little more than a band of malevolent, vagabond spirits prowling about the world, seeking the ruin of souls through various types of lies, temptations, evil consorts and other, clever subterfuge

This system of things
will continue until
the end of the age
when Jesus returns in power and glory
with all his angels and saints


At that time, the balance of Satan's divinely ordained "sentence" will finally be carried out and death itself will be utterly destroyed

(See Revelation 21:4)

Meanwhile, faithful allegiance to Jesus Christ, typically demonstrated by water baptism in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, along with full participation in the work, worship sacraments and devotions of his Holy Church will provide all the necessary protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil, as well as the genuine, blessed hope of eternal life Wouldn't it
have been a lot easier for God
to simply forgive Adam and Eve
for their sins and save himself a lot of trouble?

No. That would have left the devil in charge and kept mankind enslaved to Satan, sin and death, forever

Satan would first, have to be legitimately cast out.
Only then, under the divine rule of Jesus Christ,
could sinful mankind finally be reconciled with God
and all things be properly and justly restored


Matthew 16:18 (The words of Jesus Christ) And I say to thee: That thou art Peter; and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell (which is the power of death) shall not prevail against it...

The "flip side" of Matthew 16 logically holds that without the Holy Church, the Gates of Hell, which is the Power of Death, would indeed prevail. That's why we may *conditionally* state:

Outside the Church There Is No Salvation

(Pope Innocent III, Fourth Lateran Council, 1215)

This is subject only to the divine will and grace of our loving, creator God and sovereign Lord, the just and merciful judge of all, who might or might not deem it appropriate, at his sole discretion, to make certain allowances and/or exceptions



From the Catechism:

The Four "Marks" of the Authentic Church

866 The Church is one: she acknowledges one Lord, confesses one faith, is born of one Baptism, forms only one Body, is given life by the one Spirit...

867 The Church is holy: the Most Holy God is her author; Christ, her bridegroom, gave himself up to make her holy; the Spirit of holiness gives her life...





Through regular prayer and study along with a lifetime of full, faithful participation in the work, worship, sacraments and devotions of the Holy Church we personally encounter the one, true God coming to know him in Spirit and in Truth

What Are Devotions?

Devotions are pious practices and prayers, outside of and in addition to the official liturgical celebrations of the church, which are centered on developing a deeper understanding and appreciation of specific aspects of the Christian faith, for requesting divine blessings and favors, and for increasing personal holiness.

Approved personal devotions include the Holy Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, various nine-day prayer campaigns known as Novenas, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, devotion to the Holy Trinity, praying the Divine Office and many, many more.

To know God is to love him rightly regarding him with awe, wonder reverence, faith, hope, joy, gratitude, serenity selflessness and a profound, heart-felt respect

And we know that for those who love God all things work together unto good: those who, according to his purpose, are called to be saints.

Who Or What Are Saints?

Saints Are Those Who, By the Grace of God, Have Overcome the World, the Flesh and the Devil

Hopefully, Many Saints Are Alive On Earth Today, Predestined By God, for Heaven

Other Saints Have Already Passed Away, Experienced Particular Judgment and Subsequently, Have Been Admitted Into Heaven

At Present, the Total Number of Saints Is Not Known To Us. But, For the Edification of the Faithful and the Glory of God the Catholic Church Has Infallibly Declared By Name Approximately Ten Thousand of These Holy Men and Women

From the Catechism: 1031

The Church gives the name *Purgatory* to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned.

...The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire...

From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all, the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God.

1st John 5:5-7

...and it is the Spirit which testifies that Christ is the truth.

And there are Three who give testimony in heaven: the Father, the Word (Jesus) and the Holy Spirit.

And these three are one.

How is it possible for THREE divine and distinct PERSONS (The Holy Trinity) to constitute ONE God?

Such a thing is beyond human understanding yet God himself informs us that it's true.


There is also a very simple mathematical equation which properly "models" this fundamental article of the Christian faith:
